Clyde Public Library Levy Q & A

The Clyde Public Library will have a 1.5-mill replacement operating levy on the ballot on November 5, 2013. The levy will cost the average Clyde homeowner \$47.25 per year, or less than \$1.00 per week.


Doesn't the library already have a levy?

The library's previous levy, passed in 1994, will expire in 2014. This replacement levy will begin to be collected in 2015.

Why is this new levy necessary for the library?

Library use is up, but funding is down.

- Between 2011 and 2012, circulation rose 9% and program attendance jumped 30%. Internet use and e-book checkouts have also increased, but the library's staffing level has been reduced.
- Since 2001, state funding to the Clyde Public Library has decreased 31%. In 2012, the library received less state funding than it did in 1997.
- The current levy provides 42% of library revenue. When it expires at the end of 2014, all levy funding goes away. Nearly half of our income will disappear.



Five Days at Memorial: Life and Death in a Storm-Ravaged Hospital by Sheri Fink
